

- First two confirmed cases were detected on 23 March 2020.
- Local transmission are increased during April and May 2020 due to big religious cluster in Yangon.
- After religious cluster, imported cases were mainly detected due to returnees from other countries.
- In August, local transmission were dramatically raised in Rakhine
 State firstly and other big clusters were detected in
 - Mandalay- Myingyan cluster
 - Yangon Thingangyun cluster.








Summary of new confirmed cases detection after first two cases (as of 9.9.2020)
