CALL FOR APPLICATIONS SEAOHUN 2023 ONE HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Background

Southeast Asia One Health University Network (SEAOHUN), established in 2011 with the support of the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), is the regional Network of Universities in Southeast Asia. SEAOHUN empowers its country members to build a sustainable and competent One Health workforce to address high priority health issues, including zoonotic diseases and antimicrobial resistance. This is being achieved by leveraging education, research, and training excellence provided by the member Universities in Southeast Asia. SEAOHUN members comprise subject matter experts of multiple disciplines of One Health in 102 Universities from eight Southeast Asia countries: Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam.

With the USAID supported One Health Workforce (OHW) and One Health Workforce – Next Generation (OHW-NG) projects, SEAOHUN has provided financial support to about 50 scholarship recipients to pursue their first Master's Degree in the areas related to One Health from 2016 to 2022. In 2023, with the funding support of USAID under Transition Award, SEAOHUN is redesigning the scholarship program to better support the graduate students who demonstrate their commitment in One Health subject and have to conduct a research project as part of their study requirements. After completing their advanced studies, SEAOHUN scholarship recipients are expected to use their knowledge to advance local and national health developments in academia, government, and human and animal health organizations. With their advanced degrees, they are well-suited to work in multidisciplinary settings to prevent, detect, and respond to infectious disease threats, nationally and regionally.

In addition, the influx of students pursuing One Health training provides an impetus for new academic programs relating to One Health within host Universities. Thus, the SEAOHUN One Health Scholarship Program contributes to the development and support of One Health educational programs in SEAOHUN member Universities.

Objectives

To support graduate students in conducting One Health related research and building their research skills to solve complex health issues with One Health approaches in their respective countries after the study.

Scholarship Package

 Up to 5,000 USD per scholarship for one academic year only. The scholarship mainly aims to cover costs directly related to research projects such as data collections costs, travel costs, conference fees, publication fees, etc. Minor costs related to overall studies such as tuition fees, living expenses and/or field studies will also be considered.

Eligibility criteria to apply SEAOHUN Scholarship

To be eligible for the program, applicants must meet the following criteria:









- Possess nationality from one of the SEAOHUN member countries: Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- Consider pursuing a career in one of the following areas: environmental, animal, or human health, as well as applying the One Health concept.
- Be 40 years old or younger at the time of application.
- The highest degree obtained to date is Bachelor's or Master's or equivalent to it.
 Students with a professional degree such as MD, DVM are eligible to apply.
- Be accepted or enrolled as a full-time student in local or international Master's degree or PhD Degree program offered by one of the SEAOHUN member Universities in the following countries: <u>Cambodia</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>, <u>Lao PDR</u>, <u>Malaysia</u>, <u>Myanmar</u>, <u>Philippines</u> <u>Thailand</u>, <u>Vietnam</u>. (Please follow the links in country names to check the lists of member Universities per country).
- Be accepted or enrolled in One Health-related program that requires a research project to graduate.
- Be the applicant's first Master's Degree or PhD Degree.
- Applicants who plan or are working on research of prioritized One Health topics, approved by their graduate program.
- Priorities will be given to the applicants with research on prioritized One Health topics, research integrating gender aspects, innovative research ideas, research gaps, potential contribution of the results to target population and policy makers.
- Priorities will be given to in-service health professionals such as graduates of Field Epidemiology Training Program (FETP) and Field Epidemiology Training Program for Veterinarians (FETPV) or equivalent from government agencies of SEAOHUN member countries.

Required documents

- Photo page of valid national identification card or passport (JPEG, PNG or PDF format)
- CV / Resume in English (DOC or PDF format)
- Official academic degree and transcript of highest degree obtained.
- Letter of acceptance or enrollment to the Program or University
- A recommendation letter with the contact information of your academic advisor in English
- Statement of purpose in English (DOC or PDF format) (not more than 500 words). In your statement, you should cover the following questions:
 - What motivates you to focus your studies and research on One Health?
 - o How will the program benefit your future One Health career?
 - o How do you intend to practice One Health after graduation?
 - Demonstrate evidence of the need for financial aid for your research project and your study.
- Research Project Description of your study approved by your graduate program in English (not more than 2 pages) (DOC or PDF format) which must include
 - o Research/thesis title
 - Background (including problem statement and research gaps)
 - Research objective(s)
 - Gender integration in this research (if any)









Methodology

- How the results are expected to contribute for target groups and policy making in One Health aspect
- o Timeline of implementation
- Budget plan (up to 5,000 USD): mainly for the research project such as data collection costs, travel costs, conference fees, publication fees, etc. (minor expenses on other overall study costs such as tuition fees and living costs may also be considered).

Deliverables

- Interim progress report, final report, an article summarizing the research contribution from the SEAOHUN scholarship.
- SEAOHUN encourages scientific publications from One Health Scholarship Program recipients. In these cases, publications must include the acknowledgement and disclaimer as instructed in scholarship agreement letter.
- Additionally, all USAID beneficiaries including SEAOHUN One Health Scholarship recipients must adhere to USAID data reporting requirements of submitting products, publications, and raw datasets from proposed research project to USAID databases that will be shared during the orientation session for the selected candidates. If selected candidates receive financial support from multiple sources, principal Investigator of other funding sources may have to comply with USAID data reporting requirements.
